
The Villages at Godley Station recently unveiled an online community forum, hosted on the HOA's website, to allow residents to communicate with each other, committees. and with board members. To access the forum, residents must go to www.godleyhoa.com and register as a user by creating an account. When creating a member account, residents must do so using the email address they have on file with Sentry, the HOA's community management agency. Once registration has been submitted, the resident will be approved as a member and will be able to enter the forum, make and respond to posts, and read their neighbors' comments. The forum will also be a platform for the HOA board to share news and announcements with residents.

#### INFORMATION SHARED WILL BE EXCLUSIVE TO RESIDENTS

The forum will be housed on the site under a "members only" area so that only residents of The Arbors and Copper Village may view the information within. Comments and concerns requiring a response from the

board of directors will be addressed within the platform, ensuring communication is seen only by those within the neighborhood and not the public at large. The member forum will serve as a source of information and truth for the Villages at Godley Station. Questions and inquiries will be responded to, and all content posted to the forum will be properly vetted to ensure residents truly are getting the most accurate and current information. Any malicious subject matter will not be allowed. Posts that make unfounded references or inaccurate claims will be fact-checked and

supplemented with a post noting the results of the fact-checking process. The board wants residents to feel confident to rely on the information provided through the forum.

"We're pleased to offer this platform to connect members of our community and increase engagement through efficient communication. We are committed to making the platform a welcoming online environment where members feel comfortable expressing themselves and confident in the information they are given," HOA President Scott Fairchild said. "The board believes the forum will help

to reduce conflicts and misunderstandings while identifying issues that can be dealt with swiftly, before larger problems arise."

#### ONE TRUSTWORTHY SOURCE OF VALUABLE INFORMATION

The HOA will reduce its presence on non-official platforms, such as NextDoor, Facebook, and Instagram. This shift is designed to encourage community members to visit the forum for clear and accurate answers to their inquiries and concerns, rather than post on open sites where any user can issue a response that lacks clarity, transparency, and validity. Social media accounts, such as Facebook and Instagram, will continue to be utilized to mirror content from our official VGS website that is softer in nature, such as activities and celebrations, quick and informal reminders, community photos, and helpful tips.

#### ENHANCED SECURITY FOR AMENITIES

# UPGRADED SYSTEM WILL PREVENT FACILITIES USAGE BY NON-HOA MEMBERS

The Villages at Godley Station's HOA security measures are the community's first line of defense in protecting people, property, and assets. Keeping that responsibility top of mind, the board of directors recently started an upgrade to the amenities security system to help ensure neighborhood resources are accessible only by residents who are rightfully entitled to enjoy them.

Despite extensive efforts to restrict usage of the community's swimming pool, playground, and athletic courts to members of The Arbors and Copper Village, the facilities were repeatedly infiltrated and damaged by nonresidents. After multiple costly repairs of destroyed locks, broken fences and other unauthorized points of entry, the HOA has upgraded access features and deployed digital surveillance systems to maintain 24/7 security at our facilities.

#### HOW THE UPDATED SYSTEM OPERATES

The enhanced system includes video motion tracking with intercom and access control that senses when an individual approaches a securely locked gate. If the visitor does not enter using their app after a reasonable amount of time, the system issues a warning directing users to either open the gate with the app or leave the amenities area immediately before police are called. If the visitor continues to loiter or begins to tamper with the gate or lock, alarms will sound with a flashing strobe to encourage the violator(s) to leave. If the person still refuses to leave, then the police are contacted and the violator(s) is informed the authorities have been called.

The system's intuitive

interface also detects when multiple people enter a gated area using just one app and will employ security measures accordingly, preventing residents from holding open a gate so that non-residents can piggyback on their entry. Each user must enter using their own app. Each adult VGS resident with access is allowed up to four guests. Minors with signed waivers and access are not permitted to have guests. When multiple people are detected in one protected area and access swipes of the app do not match up accordingly, the monitoring service will be alerted.

The monitoring service can speak with the individuals present



and verify proper access and visitors allowed per member. If this is not in accordance with rules and regulations, then the monitor will direct them to leave the premises as well as obtain identification data for further use to manage this type of violation. This discourages those who are lawfully using the amenities from going back to the gate and opening it to allow non-members in.

In addition, the gate not being closed or being propped open will

also cause an alert to the monitor, which will proceed to direct, via voice instructions, the last person to enter to ensure the gate is closed properly.

#### RESIDENTS NEED APP AND PIN TO ACCESS AMENITIES

"The HOA board of directors wants our residents to live and enjoy our community facilities in peace, knowing their families are safe and protected. By enhancing our existing access controls and monitoring, we're trying to ensure that no unauthorized people monopolize, damage, or otherwise abuse our amenities," HOA President Scott Fairchild said. "When accessing the amenities, please be mindful of the new system and enter gated areas accordingly to avoid activating alarms that will trigger security response.

Residents who have not downloaded the app and have not been assigned a PIN code to pair their phone to the HOA's security system need to contact Sentry Community Management. Email adean@sentrymgt.com or sgibbs@sentrymgt.com to request a PIN, which will provide access to the neighborhood amenities. Both the app and the PIN are free to Villages at Godley Station residents.

#### FLY FLAG PROUDLY & PROPERLY

#### KEEP OLD GLORY IN GOOD CONDITION, FOLLOW PROPER ETIQUETTE WHEN DISPLAYING AMERICAN FLAG OUTSIDE HOMES

The Villages at Godley Station is home to many patriotic and proud residents, which is something greatly valued and appreciated by our community. It's no surprise that many homes display American flags, as doing so is an admirable way to demonstrate love for our country. But with the brutal weather, extreme temperatures and intense sunshine synonymous with Coastal Georgia, a patriotic gesture won't have as much of an impact if the stars and stripes begin to show signs of wear and tear.

Ensure your flag is in good condition before you fly it. Many flags can be washed gently in mild detergent to eliminate dirt, mold and mildew. Repair small tears by hand if the stitches won't be too noticeable. Flags that are heavily torn, stained, or too faded should not be displayed.

When raising your American flag, make sure the orientation is correct – the side with stars should go to the viewer's left, if hung vertically. Be careful not to reverse that or hang flags backwards or upside down. Hang your flag high enough so that it's not touching the ground or anything beneath it, and always fly the American flag above all other flags. When night falls, it's time to lower your flag unless it's illuminated. According to customs,



Old Glory should only fly between sunrise to sunset.

The majority of flags these days are designed for all-weather usage. If yours is not, though, you'll want to avoid displaying it in the rain to extend the life of the material. The flag can be partially lowered, to half-staff, on certain days of the year, such as national days of remembrance, to mark national tragedies or to acknowledge the death of a government leader, first responder or military member. To know when you should fly your flag in this fashion, you can sign up for half-staff alerts from websites such as flagsteward.org.

When it's time to store your flag, take care to prepare it properly. Follow traditional

folding technique by first holding it parallel to the ground, employing the help of another person if needed. Fold the lower stripes lengthwise over the blue Union rectangle, keeping the flag's edges straight and clean. Fold it lengthwise again, leaving the blue Union on the outside. Next, bring the striped corner of the folded edge to the open edge of the flag to make a triangular fold. Turn the outer point parallel to the open edge to make a second triangle, and keep making triangular folds until the flag appears as a triangle of blue and white stars.

# INTERESTED RESIDENTS SHOULD SUBMIT A CANDIDATE NOMINATION FORM

The Villages at Godley Station's Homeowners' Association will conduct the annual board of directors elections in January at the Annual Meeting. In order to ensure plenty of time for ballot preparation and dissemination, the candidate nomination period will open on Wednesday, Nov. 1. Anyone who is interested in serving on the HOA board is encouraged to fill out a nomination form (included in this newsletter on the following page) and return it by Wednesday, Nov. 15.

Forms can either be mailed to Sentry at 101 Mulberry Blvd., Ste. 225, Savannah, GA 31407, or scanned and emailed to community managers Amy Dean at adean@sentrymgt. com or Sam Gibbs sgibbs@sentrymgt.com. A ballot will be produced and mailed to residents by mid-December, along with an agenda and packet of informational materials for the



January Annual Meeting, which is open to all residents. Ballots may be mailed in to Sentry, scanned and emailed, placed in the secured drop box at the entrance of the clubhouse, or submitted at the Annual Meeting.

Board candidates must be in good standing with the community, having no outstanding dues or fees levied against them. Board members operate in a completely voluntary capacity after being elected by the residents of the Villages at Godley Station to act in the community's best interest. They abide by the HOA's bylaws, which govern how the association operates and contain

the guidelines by which the community is operated. Elected board members are required to attend the HOA's monthly meetings on the second Wednesday of every month. They also serve on and lead the HOA's various committees, including open spaces, events & activities, and facilities & amenities, among others. Board members are highly encouraged to attend and help with community events and celebrations, such as the annual holiday party, Easter egg hunt, back-to-school bash, and trunk-or-treat.

Serving on the board requires a commitment of 6-8 hours per month in meetings plus numerous hours of uncounted voluntary efforts to prepare for those meetings plus help with the daily guidance for current issues and events, but it is a rewarding experience. Having an active board safeguards the community's property values and helps to ensure residents' satisfaction, safety, and happiness. Becoming a board member is a great way to funnel your energy into solving community problems, meet new people, and ensure the neighborhood's rules and regulations are reflective of our community's nuanced needs and priorities. Please consider running for the board to make a difference and improve your community.

You are invited to participate in the annual voting of the 2024 HOA board of directors of the Villages at Godley Station Homeowners' Association. Once the nomination period is complete, ballots will be prepared and provided to residents who may vote by filling out their ballots and either mailing them back, emailing them to our community manager, or returning them during the Annual Meeting and budget presentation, which will be given in January 2024. More information about the date, time and format will be provided through the HOA's website, social media and message boards well ahead of time. The presence of a quorum — twenty (20) members in good standing, present in person or by proxy — is required at all annual meetings of members.

In accordance with the VGS Bylaws, the board has formed a Nominating Committee to present Association members a slate of qualified candidate(s) for election to the open board position(s). In accordance with our covenants, we are not electing specific committee / board positions; board member positions are decided by the new board at the first meeting of the year.

To be elected to the board, you will need to commit at least 6-8 hours a month for monthly board meetings plus any time it takes to perform the duties of your position. Board members serve 2-year terms, depending on the board officer position they agree to after being elected. The Nominating Committee requests that VGS members who would like to stand for election to the board to indicate their interest by submitting an application by mail or email no later than November 10, 2023, in order to be included on the ballot, which will be mailed to residents and posted online in November. The ballot will also provide spaces for write-in candidates. A written ballot may not be revoked. Send nominations to:
